Records are maintained only for the Bowstyles and Archer Categories shown above.

Rounds must be shot in competition under GNAS/FITA rules. Competitions need not be of Record Status but there must be a Judge officiating.

The 'Master' and 'Veteran' categories apply to those aged 50-59 and 60+, respectively, on the day of shooting.

Eligible rounds are restricted to those recognised for record purposes by GNAS, including age restrictions for Juniors, plus the Double FITA 70.

Distance records are maintained only for the FITA/Metric series of rounds, at the appropriate face size for the archer.

Multiple age group records may be claimed simultaneously. For example, a junior archer U16 may also claim the corresponding U18 or Senior record. Similarly, a Veteran may also claim the corresponding Master and Senior records.

Archers must be affiliated to WAA through an Associated Club.
